

The four key priorities identified in the Draft State Strategic Plan are important but inadequate. For example in my immediate locality the Crown lands comprises of endangered ecological headland, littoral, and floodplain vegetation communities of high scenic value.

These Crown lands and others like them contribute greatly to the natural landscape and character of NSW. They are important for biodiversity, climate resilience and support associated economic activities such as tourism and fisheries.

I am concerned that a quadruple bottom line approach that delivers "multiple benefits simultaneously" means an inevitable dilution of the natural values of these areas. To avoid this there should be another strategic priority; To enhance environmental values.

I appreciate the bulk of the crown land is in the western division and there is important crown land in Sydney, but where I live in regional NSW, the crown land has important biodiversity values. So I believe the four propositions are generally worthwhile, but they do not reflect the relative distribution of the land across the landscape.



The draft Strategic Plan identifies a multitude of opportunities for Crown land to be made available, developed, reserved and maintained for public and environmental purposes, to develop industry and employment, energy production and provide new tourism opportunities all of which are welcome and essential for regional and rural use of Crown land going forward.

However, In many instances these uses will not fit with recent current legislative changes made to Council managed Crown land. To enable jobs growth, commercial opportunities and sustainable economic progress in regional and rural NSW is amongst the high priorities for regional and rural Councils. It is unclear how these measures will be facilitated if the proposed outcomes are inconsistent with the Reserve purpose of the land.

The Crown Land Management Act 2016 (CLMA) provides that Crown land is reserved for public use and classified as Community land under the Local Government Act 1993 (LGA). The use of the land for commercial outcomes is inconsistent with the categorisation of the land under the LGA. Is there a planned amendment to the CLMA to provide for the re-classification of reserved land under the LGA or the transfer of the land to Council as operational land for particular commercial enterprises which would enable jobs growth, commercial opportunity and sustainable economic progress?

Repurposing Crown land to expand green and open space areas is a greater priority in metropolitan areas. The use of Crown land for biodiversity offsets for regional Councils should be encouraged.

Initiatives to strengthen and support evolving community connections is supported. Tangible measures and actions for Crown Lands support for this outcome should be included in the plan.

There are currently over 38,000 unresolved land claims over Crown Land. In order to realise Aboriginal communities potential of their land rights a clear plan of action to resolve these claims should be included in the plan.

The use of Council Managed Crown Land for the some outcomes described in the plan is mostly inconsistent with the categorisation of the land under the LGA and the guidelines for the use of the land for developing Plans of Management.

Council have been working with housing service providers to facilitate the provision of affordable housing which will in turn encourage sustainable economic progress. Is there a planned amendment to the CLMA to provide for the re-classification of reserved land under the LGA or the transfer of the land to Council as operational land to achieve this outcome?

Clarity for Councils regarding possible liability associated with future Native Title determinations will be a factor in developing Crown land for housing developments.

Transfer of this land to Local Councils as operational land would be recommended for this type of development.

The new SEPP (Aboriginal Land) 2019 mentioned in the draft plan is specific to the Central Coast area and is not applicable without amendment to other areas. As already mentioned the clearance of the backlog of unresolved Aboriginal Land Claims must be resolved to enable land transfers, improve outcomes and achieve greater collaboration with Aboriginal groups.

There is an absence of commitment in the draft plan for the support of the administrative and legislative responsibilities that have been transferred to Local Government.

Councils although responsible for managing Crown land, have not been given full access to the Crown Land resources required for full and proper management of the land.

Council Crown Land Managers should be given read access to the CLID and ALC data bases. Access to past tenure information and full spatial detail is a necessary tool in Council's proper management of the land.

Further basic Crown Land training and more complex Native Title training should be available to those Council's who require it. With one on one assistance and financial available to Council.

An expidited ALC resolution process which has not been addressed to clear the backlog of ALC's will require investigations by Council requiring additional resources

Whilst the provision of a standard lease and licence template is a good starting point Council's must be able to tailor the standard agreements to suit their particular needs.

The draft plan should provide measures and actions for the provision of support, especially financial support for under-resourced Council's who have taken on the extra responsibilies under the CLMA of managed Crown land.

Whilst the Draft State Strategic Plan provides important intitiatives for the ongoing use and strategic direction of Crown Land in New South Wales, the role of Local Government as a significant stakeholder in the management of Crown land has not been recognised.

The substantial changes brought about by the Crown Land Management Act, 2016, and Councils ongoing management of Crown land mostly as community land under the Local Government Act, 1993 is also not recognised in the Plan.

The draft plan:

Does not identify Local Government as strategic partner/stakeholder

Fails to connect with current Crown land legislation

Does not recognise prior public consultation and the role of Local Government as respresentative the community.

Has no reference to the Land Negotiation Program.

Does not make provision for ongoing support to Crown Land administrative responsibilities and the significant ongoing costs to Councils, enhanced support for Crown Land Managers is required.

The limiting effects of Aboriginal Land Claim and Native Title legislation are not considered.

Development opportunities on appropriate Crown land must adhere to Planning and regulatory requirements. The intentions to overcome "regulatory barriers " & " cut red tape " should not disregard checks and balances which are in place to ensure accountability and public interest.

Licencing and leasing provisions should recognise existing legislation

The Crown Lands portal is a missed opportunity to share information about Crown Land. Frequently, it is inoperable for days on end. When it does work it provides very limited information about only a small portion of Crown Lands. The portal could be upgraded to provide information about all types of Crown Reserves, detail initial land categorisations, provide links to adopted plans of management, detail Aboriginal Land Claims and other information.

Regular & planned training opportunities are required to ensure that an adequate number of trained Native Title Managers exist. Development of a Native Title Management portal would assist greatly to ensure good record keeping, consistent assessments, deadline management and a central location to undertake necessary notification actions.

Adequate support & further funding in relation to Plan of Management development is essential together with a committment to agreed response times. Failure of Crown Lands to resource this area properly is preventing adoption of new POM by Local Councils. Without new POM Councils are limited to activities that are consistent with existing purposes.

A clear process for vesting of Crown Lands is necessary to free up Crown Land for investment opportunities to create a range of positive community outcomes.

Faster processing of Aboriginal Land Claims is highly desirable to remove doubt, but LALC are inadequately resourced to respond to claims and provide ongoing maintenance and management of land.

Crown Lands's strategic plan is centred on supporting 'resilient, sustainable and prosperous communities. The current framework imposed on Councils since the implementation of the Crown Land Management Act (2016) is not well detailed and lacks stream-lined processes. The Act appears to have shifted the majority of the fiduciary and fiscal responsibility of Crown Land packages to Local Government, without enabling final approval abilities. Local
Government has received no extra funding or staffed hours to cope with this larger financial
cost and subsequent workload.

Generally, the Draft State Strategic Plan seems to have a focus on prioritising economic investment or exercises that result in a financial return. This seems to be inconsistent with some of the other objectives of the plan to enhance and protect environmental values. It also does not have consideration of the high costs associated with undertaking activities on Crown Land. Given the nature of Crown land being reserved for the public, it is necessary that any financial return on Crown land is reinvested in infrastructure for broader community use.

Given the recent reforms of the Crown land legislation that requires that Crown land under the Crown Land Management of Council is classified Community Land and is categorised in accordance with the Local Government Act 1993, safeguards will need to be enacted to ensure that the LG Act provisions do not prohibit the provision of affordable housing or other infrastructure developments as sought by the Draft State Strategic Plan.

The Draft State Strategic Plan does not recognise other opportunities for open space, such as cemeteries or memorial gardens. It is imperative that the value of cemeteries as open space is formally recognised as potential utilisation of Crown land, specifically as part of the consideration for expansion of green space. They also serve as historical, memorial, spiritual, aesthetic, and passive recreation green spaces.

Crown Land Managers have access to the Crown Land portal which is often awkward to utilise and often lacking in required / detailed information pertaining to Crown reserves. An improvement to this system is required in order to make the information more relevant, available, and transparent. It is necessary to ensure that Crown Land Managers are able to make more informed decisions.

Standardising leases and licencing and the development of templates for 12-month short-term temporary licences has been positive.

The Draft State Strategic Plan is silent regarding all aspects of support, being financial, resource and capability building for Crown land Managers. The role of the Crown land Manager is vastly different in workload and nature of the Reserves between metropolitan and regional Councils.

Prioritisation of the Aboriginal land transfers is a necessary component of the Draft State Strategic Plan and should be the first priority of the Plan due to the limitations of unresolved ALCs and Native Title Determinations. As addressed previously in this submission, Crown land Reserves which are subject to active ALCs, Native Title Determinations, particularly the blanket applications, essentially sterilise Crown land for partnering opportunities, development/embellishment and investment. It is necessary for resources (allocation of staff) to be allocated to address this issue so that it is managed in a "timely and effective manner" as per the Plan.

One of the four main priorities of the Draft State Strategic Plan cannot be delivered when other legislation creates barriers resulting in the current over 38,000 unresolved Land Claims as stated on page 53.

Dear Sir/Madam,

I express my concern with the inadequacy and inherent disconnect of the above draft Plan. This limits its capacity as a visionary overarching strategic plan for all Crown land in NSW as required under the *Crown Land Management Act 2016*.

Whilst it seems written from two different ministerial perspectives on how Crown land should be managed both give little attention to the critical environmental values of Crown land. This appears to reflect the administrative split in responsibilities between urban and regional areas but this should not abrogate the role and responsibility of the NSW government to take full account of ALL the values of Crown land in its strategic management direction.

The need for proper assessment, protection, management and enhancement of the critically important environmental values of Crown land estate as a core function of government is not evident in this draft Plan. Effective environmental management of Crown land delivers significant benefit to the people of NSW whether this be via ecosystem services, improved water quality, healthy soils, protection of precious biodiversity, integrated catchment management, climate change mitigation and refuge etc.

I feel this failure to fully consider the importance of the environmental values of Crown land is evident in management of both Sydney's Green Grid and regional NSW.

When NSW embarked on "reform" of Crown land in 2012 there were many statements by government that transparency was paramount and State significant land would be protected.

Since that time large areas of the Crown estate has been disappeared or mismanaged: paper roads continue to be sold without consideration of their natural vegetation corridor values, Racing NSW seems to have greater control over some Crown reserves, State Forests were earmarked for sale along with Crown reserves in Western Division, inland waterways in ecosystem collapse, young Aboriginal people denied access to cultural waters etc.

The public does still not have a readily accessible portal to identify all Crown land across the State and understand how it is managed in the genuine public interest.

Whilst government intention was to devolve its management responsibilities to other agencies considered more appropriate by government I do not feel this "transfer process" has always been transparent or effective.

For example, though Crown reserves were transferred to local government under a prescribed legislative management regime, other reserves most notably the TSR network has become vulnerable to the poorly resourced shambles of natural area administration and management in NSW.

That natural area management is not a priority for NSW government is evident in a range of decision making since 2012 eg the abolition of catchment management agencies, reduced function of the Natural Resources Commission, relaxed land clearing controls, "undermining" by delay in NSW plans and policies required in NSW's commitments to the Murray Darling Basin Plan etc.

This draft Plan continues this disregard of the environment in its actual intent despite important positive statements it makes about how public land will provide a public benefit in climate change mitigation and refuge. Overall, the draft Plan dismisses this core responsibility of government to manage Crown land for its environmental values in a proper balanced way.

One specific point I wish to make is regarding , a local Crown reserve to me. Whilst I have confidence generally that the provisions of the Local Government Act can be properly and transparently applied in the management of public land they can easily be distorted as I feel has occurred here.
In the case of a third Plan of Management over 20 years was undertaken last year. The most recent new Plan of Management was driven primarily by \$1.5 million of State and Commonwealth grants to specific interest groups. Presumably, the new PoM will facilitate long term leasing/licencing of sections of the to sectional interests. Both are currently under parliamentary scrutiny.
What this exposes however is that despite prescriptive laws to manage Crown land by Councils these can still be skewed by sectional interests which are not always consistent with the broader public interest and the need for Crown land to meet the needs of future generations.
I do not feel reducing "red tape" leasing arrangements proposed in the draft Plan appropriate. In the case of tape it affords another layer of protection over public land if/when a lease is requested by Council for the new building constructed with the grant funds.

Overall, I feel the reform of Crown land management commenced by the NSW government almost ten years ago has not produced transparent and balanced management of the whole Crown estate. This overarching draft Plan reflects this inadequacy.

It is not consistent with the objects and principles of Crown land management under the new Crown Land Management Act nor does it reflect the responsibility of NSW government to properly protect and manage public land for its environmental values.

There is a lack of hierarchy across these 4 priorities. Given that 94% of the Western Division is Crown Land mainly held under lease it would seem that there is adequate existing commercialisation of Crown Land in NSW and that community use, now and into the future, as well as ecological values should be a priority.

The priorities do not seem to reflect all the Principles of Crown Land Management outlined in the Act such as environmental protection, the conservation of natural resources of Crown land including water, soil, flora, fauna and scenic quality. A further priority is suggested that reflects the ecological importance of Crown Lands across NSW.

Without a prioritisation the outcomes have potential to conflict. Prioritise the use of Crown land for green and open space and that it must contribute to urban ecology and threatened species. Green and open space should also be prioritised in rural and regional areas and further employment opportunities in land and conservation explored, especially for Aboriginal people to care for country. The impacts of climate change should be prioritised across all outcomes now and into the future. Prioritise waterway health and work across government to ensure the holistic management of all catchments and waterways in NSW.
