Suggested walks

The Hume and Hovell Walking Track is fully signposted and provides opportunities for numerous day walks, weekend walks, or a total walk of about 24 days.

We have included some suggestions below, or you can use our discovery kit maps to help you plan your next walking trip.

Introductory walks

- Thomas Boyd Trackhead to lower swing bridge and return
- Henry Angel Trackhead to tunnel and return

1 day walks

- Snowy Mountains Highway to Thomas Boyd Trackhead
- Blowering Campsite to Browns Creek and return
- Tunnel Road to Bowna Road

2 day walks

- Bossawa Campsite to Wee Jasper
- Wee Jasper to Log Bridge Campsite and return

3 or 4 day walks

- Henry Angel Trackhead, Tumbarumba, to Lankeys Creek
- Buddong Falls to Blowering Campsite

7 day walks

- Blowering Campsite to Wee Jasper
- Henry Angel Trackhead, Tumbarumba, to Blowering Campsite

14 day walks

- Yass to Henry Angel Trackhead, Tumbarumba



Tread lightly

The track provides an opportunity to observe natural environment changes compared with Hovell's journal in 1824. Please take care of the track and its facilities and the many plants, trees and animals you will encounter on your journey.

Public transport

Rail or bus connections are available to Yass, Tumut, Tumbarumba and Albury. Yass, Tumut and Albury have a taxi service and many of the accommodation providers in nearby towns maybe able to assist in getting you on the track.

Many school bus routes intersect with the track and offer a pick up or drop off service during school terms. Contact the track co-ordinator for more details.

Mountain bikes

The track has been designed for walkers, however mountain bikes can use sections that utilise firetrails, public or Crown roads. Where the track uses the specifically constructed walking trails (single track) bikes

must be pushed or carried. The Hume & Hovell Discovery Kit shows the roads and firetrails and our track co-ordinator may be able to provide additional advice.



Get your discovery kit

To help you to explore the Hume and Hovell Walking Track, the Department of Lands has produced a series of detailed maps. The kit has an index map, six sectional maps and information on walking distances, safety hints, facilities, transport and historical information. 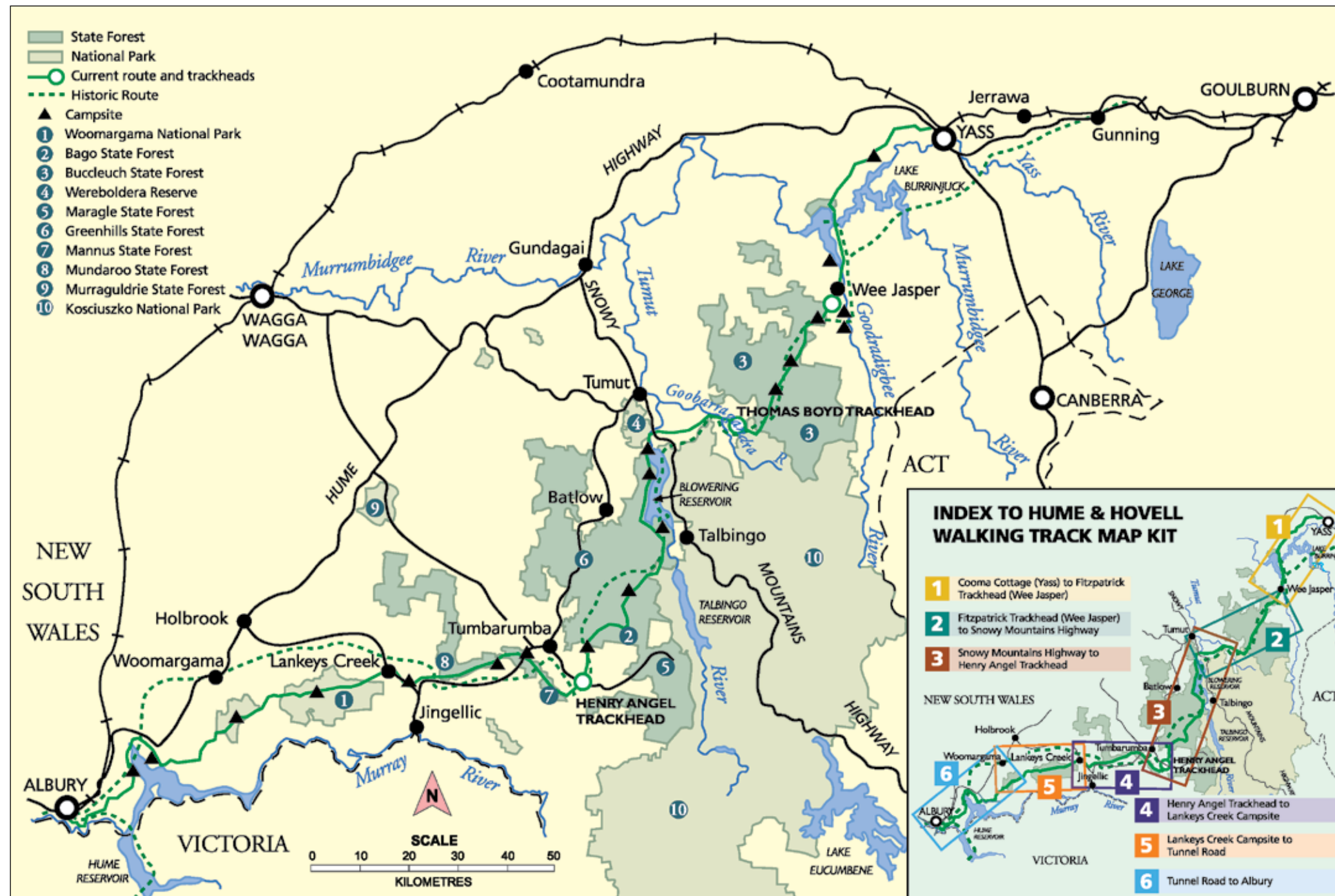
