FEDERATION WAY REPAIRS BEGIN

Urgent repairs to the iconic Broken Hill road Federation Way have begun, Minister for Natural Resources, Lands and Water Kevin Humphries announced today.

Mr Humphries said the major repair job is expected to be completed by the end of November.

“Federation Way is one of the most iconic roads in Western NSW, if not all of the State, and is one of Broken Hill’s main tourist drawcards,” Mr Humphries said.

“The \$675,630 grant provided to Broken Hill City Council by the NSW Government has enabled this badly needed upgrade to occur.

“The works will rectify the major depression in the road and drainage installation will minimise potential erosion.

“For tourists from across Australia, and indeed the world, a drive up to the top of Federation Way has become an absolutely integral part of their Broken Hill experience.

“The end result of these works will be that driving up Federation Way becomes an even better experience for the city’s residents and visitors.”

Member for Murray-Darling John Williams welcomed the announcement and said upgrading key tourist infrastructure like Federation Way will result in more domestic and international tourists visiting Broken Hill.

“I am looking forward to this vital road being open once CBH Resources has completed the surface rights relinquishment and the repair work is done,” Mr Williams said.
