

Brunswick River

Southern Breakwater Upgrade

July 2015

A \$230,000 contract has been awarded to Soil Conservation Service to carry out repair works to the Brunswick River southern breakwater at Brunswick Heads.

The Brunswick River southern breakwater helps train the river entrance which is a popular recreation area for locals and tourists.

The work involves the placement of 200 tonnes of armour rock to fill voids along the face and head of the structure which will improve the integrity of the breakwater.

The work will be completed by sealing the crest surface with a 2.4 metres wide asphalt path to improve public safety and access.

Soil Conservation Service will be managing the construction phase of the project, which will take up to 2 weeks to complete.

Rock will be stockpiled temporarily within the existing car park area. The proposed works will result in restrictions to about 50% of the car park as well as public access along the breakwater for the duration of the works.

A comprehensive environmental assessment for the project was completed and approved.

No vegetation will be impacted by the works.

The \$230,000 upgrade is part of the NSW Government's Coastal Infrastructure Program that supports local economies and benefits commercial fishing fleets and leisure boating along our coastline through repairs to maritime assets on Crown land such as breakwaters, training walls, mooring and berthing facilities.
