Dear Sir / Madam

I am aware that the Dept of Industry is considering the future use of the old airfield at Medlow Bath. And that you will be deciding on the possible granting of a long-term lease, which would allow the use of the land for aviation-based tourism, including helicopter use.

I feel very strongly, as a resident of Wentworth Falls, that the air-strip should be set aside solely for emergency use, or by National Parks, Emergency Services, Police etc.

I object to this public land being used for commercial purposes. It should be handed over to National Parks and protected forever.

If the old airfield is used by a commercial operator to run joy flights over the Upper Blue Mountains, we residents will suffer from the noise and pollution by aircraft fuel. Also, it will debase the quiet, tranquil nature of this part of the Mountains.

Please take my concerns to your meeting on 4 August or thereabouts. The peace & quiet that ^{are} so loved by residents and visitors alike will be lost forever if a commercial ~~pop~~ restaurant operator runs joy flights.

I am writing to object to the potential use of a piece of crown land, the old airfield at Medlow Bath, for aviation tourism - including helicopter use.

This is public land. I object to its use for commercial purposes. The best use of this land would be for emergencies only, managed by the National Parks and Wildlife Service.

My main objection is that this proposal would contribute to noise pollution. The mountains are a quiet, peaceful place. People from Sydney and other parts of the world visit the Blue Mountains for holidays, quiet, and time away from the noise and pollution of cities. A commercial airfield would detract from this.

Finally, the community has not been consulted about this. At the very least, I would urge you to consult with the local Blue Mountains community and take into consideration our concerns,

Re. Proposed Crown Land Lease at Meadow Bath.

My wife and I both worked and lived in Sydney before deciding to move and buy a property at Wentworth Falls in the Blue Mountains.

This was over 20 years ago and we jumped at the chance of living a more healthy lifestyle in a peaceful environment. More recently we have noticed there is an increase in the level of noise particularly over the Spring and Summer due to light planes and helicopters flying overhead. We have no objection to emergency helicopters such as CareFlight and the N.S.W. Fire Brigade but we believe there are light aircraft and helicopters flying in this area maybe from Bankstown Airport.

At a recent meeting in Katoomba we listened to a couple of tour operators who were rejoicing at the possibility of a lease being granted to a commercial operator. When challenged one said we were mad as 'Tourism' was our only real source of income.

We encourage tourists to come to the Mountains but not in helicopters or possibly light planes. It seems this is to target the rich overseas market who probably could not care less about our environment.

As part of the World Heritage National Park we are most concerned about the pollution and damage


to wildlife in this area not to mention the Blue Mountains water supply catchment nearby to the proposed airport.

It was reported in the Blue Mountains GAZETTE on the 26th June 2019 that the "WAKSENS" have now put forward a proposal to support their Application for a 50 year lease. They plan to operate a commercial airfield sealing one of the runways to allow recreational fixed wing aircraft to use it."

If this statement is correct maybe it is their intention to offer scenic helicopter charter flights and possibly light planes such as "CESSNA" and "TIGER CHEROKEE" on longer flights throughout the Mountains.

In conclusion we strongly oppose any change to the present licensing arrangement and urge you to not authorise use of this land at Meadow Bath in the Blue Mountains as a aerodrome for commercial flights. It should be transferred to the National Park and protected forever.
